Just a few simple actions will help bees thrive:



- planting/maintaining bee-attractive flowering perennials, berries, flowering trees, ground covers/cover crops (such as clovers, mustard, vetch), restored native meadows, flowering hedgerows, and other flowering plants that allow bees to forage throughout the year.
- helping bees nest by leaving undisturbed (untilled) ground and dead trees or snags, and also by providing native bee nesting boxes
- using Integrated Pest Management to minimize or avoid pesticide use

Continuing Programs

The Council supports economic growth through sustainable use and conservation of natural and agricultural resources in the region of Marin, Sonoma, Lake and Mendocino counties of California. The Council's activities in 2011 were to continue work in the following priority areas:

Agri-tourism: Continued to support workshops for farmers and ranchers pursuing value-added, sustainable tourism opportunities on their lands.

Beekeeping/Pollinator Supply: Continued to promote bee friendly farming, and educate farmers, ranchers, and consumers about choices to provide healthy habitat for our pollinators

Support Local Food Distribution/Development/ Cooperative Food Gardens: continued to support grow local/eat local initiatives throughout the 4-county area

Biochar or Other Product from Biomass Energy Development: continued to partner with others to further the sustainable development of this renewable energy source.

New Cultivating Commerce Initiative Launched

Cultivating Commerce reflects the new mission statement adopted at the beginning of 2011. Through this initiative to support entrepreneurship in sustainable agriculture, our Council promotes agricultural diversity, fosters conservation, and promotes economic opportunities compatible with sound environmental stewardship practices. Cultivating Commerce was launched in the Fall of 2011, and work efforts have included general farmer and rancher entrepreneurship support through:

- Submitting grant applications to support entrepreneurships in sustainable agriculture in Mendocino and Lake Counties


Financials

The year 2011 was challenging—in April, all funding and support from the National Resources Conservation Services abruptly ceased for our organization as well as all RC&DCs across the nation. For us, this involved the complete elimination of a full service free office space and elimination of a full-time NRCS Coordinator who served as a quasi-Executive Director.

The Council rapidly re-grouped and began to diversify funding sources, beginning to rely more

heavily on donations and grants from private foundations and philanthropic companies and individuals. The changes in our financing are reflected in the following chart and information for 2011:
